





Some people say that mainlanders are buying up the daily necessities, but I think this problem ended a few years ago. Now the mainland economy is developing quickly. Even Hong Kong cannot follow their speed of growth. Their daily necessities have become better and better now. Many mainlanders now buy their daily necessities domestically in China now. If one cannot find daily necessities in shops, they can be purchased online. I disagree that mainland Chinese are buying up all of Hong Kong's daily necessities.

Some people complain that they cannot get a seat on the MTR. However, I think it is not all because of mainlanders. It has been a problem in Hong Kong for many years already. In Hong Kong there are seven million people who all live in this very cramped, small place. In the morning people all need to go to their place of work. Hundreds of thousands of Hong Kong's daily commuters don't own a car or ride a taxi, bus or minibus. They use the MTR. It has been this way in Hong Kong for several decades now. <u>Coffin Homes – Any Solution in Sight?</u>



'There is a mouse running straight to your bed!'

'I see it - but my room is so small and crowded that I can't even move quickly enough to catch it!'

This conversation is not a soap drama script, but a talk that has just occurred between two men living in subdivided flats. Not being able to move about a room quickly enough to catch insects or rodents may seem extremely bizarre to us as students, but many other Hong Kong residents are suffering identical problems living in subdivided, caged homes.

According to a recent magazine article, there are approximately 200,000 Hong Kong citizens living in so called 'coffin homes', which include tiny cubicles or subdivided compartments within one apartment unit. Fortunately, there are an array of remedies to this current situation.

First and foremost, our government should definitely increase the housing supply to meet the needs of its increasing population. Since Hong Kong is such a small city densely packed with so many people, purchasing one's own flat seems to be out of reach. However, if the housing supply can be increased as soon as possible, the current shortage can easily be resolved.

There are many plans for housing development in Hong Kong such as developing the outskirts of country parks and the reconstruction of older buildings. These development plans are suitably designed to suit Hong Kong's needs, but many are waiting for official government bureaucratic approval before starting to build. If our government can speed up the process of considering these well-organized and useful plans, there is no doubt that the housing supply will rapidly increase. Additionally, the more housing supply there is, the lower property prices will be and the more likely people can purchase their own flats. Therefore, the number of people living in coffin homes can be greatly reduced.

In addition to increasing housing supply, the introduction of laws regulating subdivided flats is also needed. Currently, there are not many laws that properly regulate the use and sale of subdivided flats as existing what laws contain numerous loopholes. Consequently, many owners are selling unsafe, insecure and illegally subdivided flats. For example, some coffin homes are divided to such an extent that tenants can't move easily around in them. This greatly dampens the quality of life for many residents and even puts their lives at risk as they may not be able to safely escape a fire due to the lack of fire alarms and stairway access. If laws regulating the construction of these flats can be introduced – and actively enforced, the number of illegal flats will definitely drop. This outcome could prevent tenants from living in confined areas and reduce their exposure to hazardous living spaces.

Apart from the above, financial support should also be provided to solve the problem from its stem. Even in this millennial era where our beloved hometown is full of vibrancy, the disparity between the privileged and the disadvantaged is still painfully evident. As financial constraints are a major contributor to the number of growing coffin home tenants, aid given to first time flat purchasers might greatly alleviate the problem.

To conclude, 'coffin homes' have become a divisive, controversial issue recently. Proper solutions like increasing the housing supply, providing financial support and introducing applicable laws should be implemented. If suitable solutions are used to tackle the current problem, there is no doubt that the problem can be solved in time. I also hope that our government can listen to the clamor of its residents and take these solutions into proper consideration.
