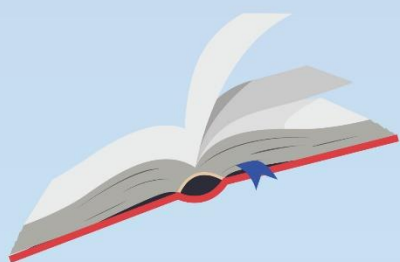


Life is Fantastic

I really like how you use punctuation to communicate feeling – particularly exclamation marks (!). Quite effective.


You also make effective use of sequencing words such as 'First', 'Next'. They are helpful tools for showing the reader what kind of information is being described.
