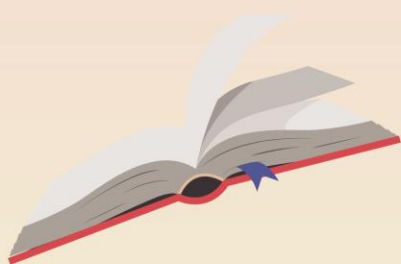

Work-Life Imbalance - Any Solution in Sight?

“Sorry, my dear! I need to work on the weekend, so I cannot join you.”

Work-life imbalance not only appears in soap dramas, but also real life. It is very common in Hong Kong. In recent years, this problem has perplexed Hong Kong’s employees. It reduces their rest time and may negatively impact their mental and physical health.

Heavy work loads are one reason why many Hong Kong employees cannot get enough rest. If they have not finished their work, they need to work overtime at the office. Many Hong Kong supervisors just concentrate on company achievement and neglect their employees’ needs.

The Hong Kong Government should legislate standard working hours and impose a ban on unpaid overtime. If employers require workers to work overtime, they need to increase their wages. This law can protect employees’ rights and health by ensuring they complete their workday on time.

However, if employees want to enhance their income, the new legislation can give them the option of voluntarily extending their paid working time. At the same time, the government and Federation of Trade Unions can provide more support and labor subsidies, such as health care and transport allowances. These can help soothe employee’s money worries. They will also have more time to spend with their family and friends.

Finally, Hong Kong is a dynamic, bustling city. It is an international economic and financial center. Many people have to work late hours as they must focus on overseas stock markets. Finding the time to enjoy life may be hard for them. Supervisors often impose strict rules on workers such as not working from home even if employees may have to care for children or elderly parents. The proposed measures can increase the time for workers to tend to family duties.

All the above are reasons why Hong Kong employees must be given paid overtime arrangements. I hope that employers can help their workers build closer, healthier links to their family and friends.

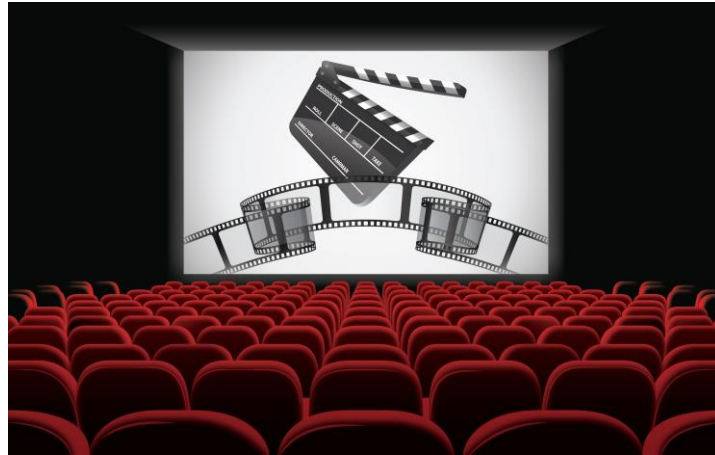

A Report on Cinemas



This report investigates the issue of fewer people visiting cinemas. It will explain why this is happening and suggest what could be done to increase the number of moviegoers.

First and foremost, with many affordable online streaming options available on people's phones and computer devices nowadays, it is inconvenient and expensive for them to go to cinemas and watch movies.

Nowadays technology is rapidly developing. Many movie viewing platforms such as YouTube and Netflix provide different types of films and shows for people to watch. People can choose films they want to watch no matter if they are new or old ones. Moreover, people can watch movies anytime, anywhere. Online applications have dramatically improved the flexibility of watching films as they are more convenient and cheaper than going to cinemas.

Additionally, watching movies in cinema is not economical. The cost of watching movies in Hong Kong is soaring. Nowadays the average price of a

movie ticket is as high as \$140. For many people this cost is too extravagant. As a result, many consumers have switched to the cheaper online options mentioned before. For example, a Netflix account allows four people to have access to their favorite films at the same time. Users can share the cost of a single monthly fee. This is much more economical and has caused the number of moviegoers to drop.

Furthermore, many people complain it takes a long time to line up before watching a film in a theatre. Also, people complain of interference from people's ring tones on their smartphones. Even worse are the sounds of people who speak and eat loudly. These various elements disturb audiences and ruin their moods. Therefore, many people are reluctant to go to cinemas.

The above are reasons that explain the decrease in the number of moviegoers. In light of these reasons, we have the following suggestions to help solve the problem.

One suggestion is to provide economic incentives that attract customers. For instance, cinemas can set film prices at a reasonable level and provide holiday discounts. On weekends, moviegoers buy two tickets and get one free. This will make the price more affordable. People will be more willing to go to cinemas during their time off. Therefore, this can help increase cinemas' profits.

Finally, cinemas should promote their special features such as surround sound, 3D screens and other special effects like vibrating screens. These kinds of advanced equipment help audiences to enjoy movies more fully. The most important mission of cinemas is to stress their uniqueness and high-tech movie-watching enjoyment. This can boost people's desire to visit cinemas.

Dear Editor,

I am writing to express my disagreement with the recent claim that recent Hong Kong university graduates are less hardworking and unwilling to face challenges than prior generations.

The claim is grossly inaccurate as Hong Kong's work environment is vastly different from just a decade ago. Nowadays, it is much more difficult for new university graduates to obtain full, meaningful employment. Graduates must make great efforts to obtain even low salaried, menial work.

Nowadays, globalization has significantly impacted the workforce new graduates enter. They have to compete with international applicants for job opportunities. Overseas graduates are more favored by employers than local graduates because of their fluent English and international exposure. Fresh Hong Kong graduates have to work much harder and frequently update their skills in order to stay employed.

Moreover, at most international businesses, new Hong Kong graduates are required to work longer hours to satisfy overseas clients' needs. For example, one of my brothers is a new graduate who works for a multinational corporation. He has to work very late every day to communicate and make deals with his clients in the United States. The next morning, he has to report his work progress to his boss. Because of this, he must work overtime most days and sacrifice his

leisure time with us. This is just one of the many convincing cases that shows new Hong Kong university graduates are just as hardworking as their older peers are.
